Structure of Our Student Council

- An election takes place
- Two representatives from each class 1st 6th

- Each child gets a vote

- 1. Ask your Teacher for a parental permission form
- 2. Talk to your parents about your participation
- 3. Bring the parental permission form in on Wednesday
- 4. Plan your election campaign
 - 1. Think about the things you would like to do
 - 2. Make a poster telling your classmates about your ideas
- 5. Display your poster in your classroom on Wednesday Friday
- 6. Voting will happen on Friday morning
- 7. Newly elected members will be announced on Friday afternoon
- 8. The first Student Council meeting will take place after Halloween
